THURSDAY, March 9th, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Crisfield renewed the motion made by him on yesterday, to be excused from serving on the committee appointed upon the memorial of Rachel R. Wagner, of the city of Baltimore, praying for indemnity;

On the question being put, will the house excuse him from serving on said committee;

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The Speaker thereupon appointed Mr. Culbreth on said committee, in place of Mr. Crisfield, who was excused by the house.

The motions made by Messrs. Maulsby and Ridgely to be excused from serving on said committee, were severally withdrawn by them.
