And, Mr. Brengle reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act to provide for the instruction of youth in primary schools, throughout this State; passed at December session 1825, ch. 162;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the Sheriff of Queen Anne's county;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1833, ch. 110;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Kendall C. Cropper, of the city of Philadelphia;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for keeping in repair the public roads of Prince George's county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate a company, to make a turnpike road from the town of Cumberland, to the Pennsylvania line, so as to intersect the turnpike road from Bedford, in the direction of Cumberland;

And, the bill, entitled, an act to limit the time for which tobacco inspectors shall continue to hold their offices, severally endorsed, 'will pass,' and severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise and empower Elizabeth Duvall, executrix of Grafton B. Duvall, of Anne Arundel county, to sell and dispose of her negro man Wm. Philips, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State, endorsed 'will not pass;'

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the building a bridge over a stream across the road leading from Salisbury to Derickson's cross roads, in Worcester county, passed at December session 1835;

Also the bill entitled, an act to divorce Lucy O'Brien of Montgomery county, from her husband William O'Brien;

Also the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session 1809, ch. 138;

Severally endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;'

Which amendments were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.
