Determined in the negative.

The bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the building a bridge over the Western Run, in Baltimore county, at the place therein mentioned, passed at December session 1835, ch. 58, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. McDamel, entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Kent county to condemn a lot of land for the purpose of making a causeway or dam over the Narrows at Eastern Neck Island, and to appoint commissioners to make a contract for the making of said dam or cau eway over the said Narrows, at or near the place where the bridge crosses the sand Narrows, in the county aforesaid, was taken up for consideration.
