The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

Mr. Culbreth, reported a bill, entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of the Sheriff of Anne Arundel county, for keeping prisoners in jail and to provide for the maintenance of debtors actually confined in prison.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Brengle, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Dawson, entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel S. Hays, of Montgomery county, administrator of William Trail deceased.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Maulsby,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning, 9 o'clock.
