The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Alexander, chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Bank of Allegany.

Said bill was amended, by inserting after the name of 'James Smith,' in the 1st section, the names of 'George McCulloch and John Pickell.'

Said bill was further amended, by striking out in the 2d section, 2d line, the words 'not exceed ten,' and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'consist of five.'

Said section was further amended, by adding at the end thereof the following proviso—

'Provided, however, that said bank shall, at any time within three years from the passage of this act, have power to enlarge its capital to one million of dollars.'
