Mr. Kerr, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which was referred the order of the house, requiring said committee, to enquire into the expediency of reducing into one, all the various laws on the subject of testamentary affairs, and the duty of executors and administrators, reported unfavourably thereon, and recommended its reference to a select committee.

Which was read the first and by special order the second

time and concurred in.

The Speaker thereupon appointed Messrs. Alexander, Igle-

hart and Darby, to compose the committee.

Mt. Tuck, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act for the relief of George Fouke, and Elizabeth his wife, and Henry, and Lewis Fouke;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the

table.

Mr. Pichardson, chairman of the committee on lotteries reported a bill, entitled, and act in aid of the construction of a State Armory and town Hall in the city of Baltimore, and the rebuilding and improvement of the Hanover Market Home in said city, accompanied with the following report—

And, Mr. Doub, reported a bilt, entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry Boyer, and Mary Carlin, of Frederick county;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to

lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Richards of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Isaiah Richards;—Also,
