

Mr. Primrose, seconded by two other members that voted in the majority, moved to reconsider the vote of the house, upon the order submitted by Mr. Buchanan this morning, in relation to certain alterations and amendments in the constitution,

On the question being put, will the house reconsider their vote,

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Ridgely called for the yeas and nays;

Pending this motion,

A deputation from the senate being announced, Messrs. Ricaud and Schley, members of that body, appeared within the bar and acquainted the Speaker and the House of Delegates, that in accordance with the joint invitations of both houses, which had been personally communicated to him, the Governor was then attending in the senate chamber, where the senate requested the attendance of the Speaker, with that of the other members of this house to witness the qualification of the Governor.

The Speaker thereupon left the chair, and attended by the members of this house went to the senate chamber, where the Hon. Thomas W. Veazey, was duly qualified as Governor of the State of Maryland, in the presence of both houses, in the manner and form prescribed by the constitution and laws thereof.

The Speaker attended by the members of this house, returned and resumed the chair.

On motion of Mr. Harris,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday; the proceedings of yesterday were read.
