The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the widening of Orange Alley, in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1827, chap. 124;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, entitled, an act authorising Henry Feete, surviving Executor of Jacob Alexander, of Frederick county, deceased, to execute the last will and testament of the said deceased;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Matthias,

The house took up for consideration, the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to establish a line between Carroll and Baltimore counties;—And,

The unfavourable report of the committee recommending the rejection of said bill;

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, and the question put, will the house concur in the report of the committee recommending the rejection of said bill;

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Perry,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to incorporate a company, to supply the town of Frostburg in Allegany county, with wholesome water, and the amendments reported thereto from the committee on corporations;

The amendments having been read the second time, were assented to;

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed;

On motion of Mr. Perry,

The title of said bill was amended by striking out the words, "unwholesome water," and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "abundant supply of water;"

On motion of Mr. Mauleby,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.
