Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Townsend, of Worcester, from the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Handy, entitled, an act to incorporate the Saint Martin's Canal and Navigation Company;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ford, seconded by two other members that voted in the majority, moved to reconsider the vote of the house upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to establish a line between Carroll and Baltimore counties;

On the question being put, will the house reconsider their vote,

It was determined in the negative.

The said bill was then returned to the senate.

The door-keeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government of the State of Maryland.

Mr. Simmons moved to postpone the consideration of said amendments until Friday next;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Simmons then moved to amend the amendments of the senate, by striking out from the word 'Annapolis,' in the ninth section, seventh line, to the word 'cease,' inclusive in the tenth line thereof;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Simmons then moved to amend said amendment by striking out in the eleventh line thereof 'four,' and inserting 'five,'

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Carpenter then moved to amend said amendment by inserting in said section, after the word 'Montgomery,' the word 'Charles,' and strike out the word 'Charles' in the 19th line.

Mr. Henderson moved to amend said amendment by inserting 'Cecil,' in the 15th line thereof after 'Somerset,' and striking out 'Cecil' in the 18th line;

Determined in the negative.
