indictment in the county courts, in the same manner as

other fines or forfeitures now are.

Sec. 31. And be it enacted, that if, upon counting the baliots or votes, it shall be found that a majority of said votes shall have been given in favorof holding a convention, then, and in that case it shall be the duty of the next General Assembly, as soon as it shall be organised, to provide by law for the holding of a convention to reform the government of this State, in accordance with the wishes of the people.

Sec. 32. And be it enacted, that the several counties and cities shall be represented in said convention, as they are entitled to be now represented in the House of Delegates.

Which was read.

Mt. Gough moved that said amendment be rejected

Resolved in the affirmative

The said amendments having been severally read the second time, the question was then put, will the house assent to said amendments;
