

Were sent to the Senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorise James M. Selden, of Baltimore county, to bring into this State the several slaves therein named;

And, the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Buckingham academy, in Worcester county, passed at December session 1813, chap 13;

Were returned to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Coombs,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to regulate the hauling of scins on the Potomac river;

On motion of Mr. Carpenter,

The house was called and the doorkeeper sent for the absent members;

On motion of Mr. Brengle the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session, during the absence of the doorkeeper;

Mr. Brengle, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick and Montgomery counties, praying the passage of an act, to open and make a road leading from Damascus, in Montgomery county, to intersect the road leading from Frederick to the District;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brengle, Doub and Dawson.

Mr. Brengle, also presented a petition of Amos Norris, and others counter to the petition of sundry citizens praying the passage of an act authorising the levy court of Frederick county, to levy a sum of money to enlarge and improve the court house of said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brengle, Bowlus and Doub.

Mr. Brengle, also presented a petition of Ann Murphy and others, praying the passage of an act authorising them to sell certain property;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Richardson, presented a petition of Henrietta Verner, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Samuel James Verner;—And,

Mr. McLean, presented a petition of Henriett Harris, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Gowin Harris;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Taylor, presented a petition of sundry citizens of
