

Mr. Crisfield, from the select committee, to which was recommitted the bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act for founding a University in the city or precincts of Baltimore, by the name of the University of Maryland, reported the same with the following amendment,

Amendment proposed.

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert the following,

"That no member of the Medical Faculty of the University of Maryland, shall at any time be dismissed or removed without the concurrent votes of at least nine of the Trustees of said College.

Sec 2. And be it enacted, That hereafter on a vacancy of any Medical Professorship, the remaining members of the medical faculty shall have power to nominate three persons, out of whom the Trustees shall appoint one to succeed as professor to the vacant professorship.

Sec 3. And be it enacted, That on a vacancy occurring hereafter in the office of demonstrator, or in any other subordinate office, relating to the medical department the professors shall nominate two persons, out of whom the trustees shall select and appoint one to fill the vacant office, and the demonstrator and every other subordinate officer shall be removed by the trustees whenever they are requested so to do by any five of the professors.

Sec 4. And be it enacted, That hereafter no rule or ordinance of the board of trustees, now or hereafter to be passed, affecting the discipline or administration of the medical department of the University, if the same shall be disapproved by the medical faculty, or two thirds of the whole number thereof shall be of any validity or force, unless the same, after such disapprobation, shall be re-affirmed and re-enacted by the concurrent votes of two thirds of the whole number of trustees."

Which were read the first and second time by special order.

The door-keeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, an act to regulate the hauling of seines on the Potomac river.

Mr. Coombs moved to amend said bill by striking out in the first section, 11th line, the word 'six,' and inserting in lieu thereof 'five,'
