Which was read.

Mr. Parran, moved to amend said amendment by inserting after the word "counties," these words, "in rateable proportions among said counties;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Gough, offered as a substitute for said bill and amendment the following.

An act to invest the Surplus Revenue coming to this State from the general government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That one million two hundred and seventy-five thousand four hundred and fifty one dollars, being the portion of this States' share of the surplus revenue of the United States, be and the same is hereby directed to be paid by the treasurer of the Western Shore, as he may receive the same, to the extinguishment of the debt of the State.

Which was read.

On the question being put, will the house adopt said substitute?

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred upon the amendment as offered by Mr. Tuck.

Mr. Tuck moved to amend said amendment by adding at the end thereof, the following,

Provided, however, that the said sum so deposited, shall be rateably apportioned among the said counties, and shall be loaned according to said apportionment; but if the whole amount assigned to any county, shall not be borrowed by the inhabitants of said county within two months, the said bank may loan the residue to the inhabitants of the other counties aforesaid.

Determined in the negative.

The question again recurred upon the amendment as first offered by Mr. Tuck, and

Determined in the negative.
