And provided further, That it shall be the duty of the Visiters and Governors to receive into their said College, and to afford poard and tuition, ree of charge therefor, to any number of scholars, not exceeding the number of twenty-one, at the same time, who shall be presented, from time to time, under the authority of the State, and as may here-
