Mr. Tuck submitted the following message,

By the House of Delegates,  
March 18, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose, with your concurrence, the appointment of a joint committee, who shall during the recess of the Legislature, visit and examine into the condition of the University of Maryland, with power to send for persons and papers, and report thereon to the next General Assembly, and, if in their opinion it be necessary, propose a plan for the reorganization and government of that institution. Mr. Carpinter moved to refer said message to the consideration of the next General Assembly;

Resolved in the affirmative.
