

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house the petitions and documents presented by the heirs of John H. Stone.

On motion of Mr. Buchanan,

Ordered, That Col. William Lamar, of Allegany county, have leave to withdraw from the files of this house his petition for remuneration for his revolutionary services.

On motion of Mr. Crisfield,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of this house the petition of Emeline R. Hall, for a divorce from her husband, filed in 1833.

Mr. McLean, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Donoho, entitled, an act to repeal an act, entitled, an act to appoint State Wharfingers in the city of Baltimore, and to authorise the collection of wharfage in certain cases in the said city, passed December session, 1827, chapter 162,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the committee on corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to unite Middletown, Keller's Addition to Middletown, Grove's Addition to Middletown, and Wise's Addition to Middletown, into one, by the name of Middletown, and incorporate the same, passed at December session, 1833, chapter 145,

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ely submitted the following resolution —

“Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Baltimore county be, and they are hereby authorised and directed forthwith, at their discretion, to select and designate the place at which the polls shall hereafter be held in the first election district of Baltimore county; any thing contained in any law to the contrary notwithstanding; Provided always, that the place which they may so designate and fix shall be situate on the Frederick Town Turnpike Road, and be west of the sixth mile stone,”

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.
