

Mr. Boyd, from the committee on divorces, reported a bill, entitled, an act to divorce Henrietta Harris, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Gowin Harris,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Canton Company of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Handy, entitled, an act to authorise and require the levy court of Worcester county to select places for holding the elections in certain districts in said county, And

The bill reported by Mr. Carpinter, chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Sophia Neville, of Cecil county, from her husband, Thomas Neville,

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Boyd, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made unfavorable reports upon the petitions of Sarah Shryock, Elizabeth Downing, Nathaniel Burke, Mary Moore, Benjamin Marshall, and Jason Jones, severally praying to be placed on the pension roll,

Which were severally read the first and by special order the second time, and severally concurred in.

Mr. Boyd, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favorable report upon the petition of Mary Carlin, widow of William Carlin, a soldier of the revolution, accompanied with the following resolution—

“Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Mary Carlin, widow of William Carlin, soldier of the Revolution, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during her life,”

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Billingsley, from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favorable report upon the petition of the heirs of Bennet Braeco, a soldier of the Revolution, accompanied with the following resolution—
