Also, the resolutions in favor of Ann Millard, Elizabeth Ayres and Susanrah Shirley,

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to provide for taking the sense of the people of Baltimore county, on the propriety of separating said county, from the city of Baltimore,

Was returned to the senate.

The Speaker laid before the House a communication from Richard Lemmon, Robert Barry and James Cheston, Esqrs. Commissioners under the Indemnity laws of December session 1835, with the written testimony on which as Commissioners they founded their awards to the several individuals,

Which was read and referred to a select committee composed of Messrs. Ridgely, Crisfield, Maulsby, Tuck, and Harding.

The Speaker also laid before the house a report from the Clerk of Charles county Court, relative to the attendance of Judges,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, laid before the House a report from said Clerk relative to the several sums of money paid by him into the Western Shore treasury, within the year ending on 30th of November,

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for electing Commissioners for Washington county, and prescribing their powers and duties,
