

On motion of Mr. Gough, referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill reported by Mr. Buchanan, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from such point as the Somerset and Cumberland Turnpike Company of Pennsylvania shall fix upon at the Pennsylvania line, to the public square in the town of Cumberland, or to intersect the United States' road, commonly called the National road, at such point as may be most convenient and practicable, reported the same without amendment

Mr. Maulsby, chairman of the committee on insolvency, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Doyle, of Allegany county,

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. McLean,

The House took up for consideration the bill reported by him from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, entitled, an act relating to limited partnerships in this State;

On motion of Mr. McLean,

Said bill was laid on the table, and made the order of the day for Wednesday next, the 11th instant.

The bill reported by Mr. Mann, entitled, an act authorising and requiring the commissioners of Washington county to levy, at their next annual levy, a sufficient sum in advance, to pay jurors and State witnesses in said county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to divorce Harriet Ridgely, of Baltimore county, from her husband Greenbury Ridgely, endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of Ann Millard, widow of Joshua Millard, deceased, endorsed "assented to," ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
