

TUESDAY, January 10, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of James Doyle, of Allegany county;

And the bill, entitled, an act authorising and requiring the commissioners of Washington county, to levy at their next annual levy, a sufficient sum in advance to pay jurors and state witnesses in said county;

Were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Dawson, presented a memorial of James W. Fling of Montgomery county, Ex'tr. of James Fling, a soldier of the revolution, praying the passage of a resolution authorising the payment of the arrears of pension due the said James Fling, at the time of his death, to Henry Harding;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Dawson, also presented a memorial of Asa Hyatt, Philemon M. Smith, and others, citizens of Montgomery and Frederick counties, praying for authority to lay out and open a certain road in said counties;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Dawson, Bren-
gle and Harding.

Mr. Matthias, presented a petition of John Formwalt; Michael Sullivan, David Leister and others, praying an act of incorporation as therein set forth and specified;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Matthias, Bren-
gle and Bowlus.

Mr. Richardson, presented a memorial of the commis-
sioners of the Real Estate Bank of Baltimore, praying to
be allowed to go into operation with a capital of five hun-
dred thousand dollars;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on ways
and means.

Mr. Richardson, also presented resolutions of the Mayor
and city council of Baltimore, asking the passage of an
act to enable them to condemn for the extension of the Bel-
air market, a certain lot of ground therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Richardson,
McLean and Ely.

Mr. Doub, presented a petition of a number of voters of
Frederick county, praying that the act passed at December
session 1835, to create Carroll county, "out of parts of Fre-
derick and Baltimore counties, may not be confirmed;"
