The bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed the rein mentioned;

Was returned to the Senate.

Which was read and referred to a select committee composed of Messrs. Richardson, Risteau, Ballard, Gardiner and Price.

Mr. Parran, presented a petition of Sarah Ann Sears, of Calvert county, praying to be divorced from her husband Robert Sears;

Which was read and referred to the committee on di-

vorces.

Mr. Tuck, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, praying that Benjamin Chaney, Jr. may be placed on the pension list of said county;

Which was read and reterred to the committee on pen-

sions to indigent persons by county assessment.

On motion of Mr. Iglehart,

Ordered, That the committee on inspections be instructed to inquire into the propriety of providing by law a standard for the measurement of corn in ears.
