Also, to reporta bill to regulate the administration of justice in criminal cases, before the station house justices in Baltimore city, and the criminal jurisdiction of justices of the peace in said city;

Also, to report a bill regulating deposits in Savings' Banks, and to allow small sums of money to be paid without administration.

Also, to report a bill to require the officers of corporations in this State, to take an oath of allegiance to the United States.

On motion of Mr. Briscoe,

Leave was granted the committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill to make valid the last will and testament of Benjamin Quill, free negro, late of Calvert county, deceased, and to authorize his widow and devisee to hold and dispose of the property thereby bequeathed and devised.

On motion of Mr. Jenkins,

Leave was granted the committee on Judicialr Poceedings to report a bill to suspend process on all writs of executions in this State, issued against the property of the citizens thereof.

Mr. Carroll, from the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, "An Act to repeal the fourth Section of the twelfth Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to Banks;"
