After the word "Convention" in twenty-sixth line of 1st section add "and the said Judges in their said return shall certify that no organized military or other armed force had appeared at the place where the polls had been held and interfered with the said election, and in case of such military interference within any election district of the counties or precinct in the city of Baltimore, it shall be the duty of the Governor to order a new election after ten days notice in said election district or precinct, but such return, and order of a new election shall not interfere with the assembling of the "Convention" as herein provided ;"
