That Whereas your petitioners hath had the Liberty & bennifit of a roade this Many years to our Lands and Marches On the Beaches with our Cattle and also to pass with Cartes and horses about Our Busines without Let or Interruption but of Late wee are bard and hendred by reason of a certain John Miller who hath Built a Mill upon a branch Over which our Roade went and he hath made his Dam so narrow that it is not possible to pass over with our Carts Nor to drive or forge our Cattle Over the said dam so that your petitioners are Obliged to drive our Creatures many Miles round to our Marshes for want of the liberty and bennefit of our Roade and also for the passing Over with our Carts for which Reason your petitioners are put to many ft Conveniences and prays that your worship would take it into your Consideration and order the aforesd Miller to make your petitioners a good and suffi: ent Roade Over the branch where his mill is that so your petitioners May have the Liberty and bennifit of our former Roade as we have formerly had and your petition: ers as in duty bound shall for Ever pray - Richard Wood Craft Martin Keanel & the rest
