

20th day of March 1729/30 which being Read and Heard he Libetia prays an hearing of the condition of the
 same writing and he hath it in these words The condition of the above Obligation is that if the above
 bounden John Didel Joseph or Peter Babt^t Conely & the Rev^d Thomas Fletcher or either of them their
 heirs &c^s admt^r or aforesaid shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto Hugh Porter to have his
 heirs &c^s admt^r the sum of thirty pounds Irish Value at or before the 20th day of September next
 or deliver the above named John Didel who is now a prisoner into the custody of the above named
 Hugh Porter then the above Obligation to be void and of none Effect or otherwise to remaine
 in full force power and Virtue in Law which being Read and Heard he prays that the Briguall writt
 on the writing Obligatory aff^d by the aff^d John Tunstale a signee of the said Hugh Porter Impre-
 scribed may be Enrolled and it is Enrolled in these words Vizt Somerset County vs Charles absolute
 Lord and Proprietor of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c^r to
 the Sheriff of Somerset County Greeting we command you that you take Patrick Conely late of
 Somerset County fett maker Otherwise called Patrick Conely of the same place Hatter Isle
 shall be found in your Bailiwick and have safe keep so that you have his body before our
 Justices of Our County Court of Somerset to be held at Dwidrig Creek the third Tuesday of March
 next to answer unto John Tunstale signee of Hugh Porter according to the form of the act of
 Assembly in such case provided of apslea that he tender unto him Thirty pounds Sterling which
 to him the Breth and unjustly detaineth & hindrefail not at your perille and have you there
 here this witt witness Samuel Hopkins Gent Chief Justice of Our said Court the 20th day
 of November in the 17th year of Our Dominion &c^r and Dated 1731 Thomas Hayward Clerk Lewi-
 gal Ist December 1731 -- which being Enrolled the said Patrick Conely having
 Read the same he saith that the aff^d John Tunstale signee of the said Hugh Porter his action
 aff^d by vertue of the writing Obligatory aff^d against him to have or maintain ought not because
 protesting that there is avairance between the writing Obligatory aff^d and the Briguall writt
 above thereon Impeetrated by means whereof that writt ought to abate protesting also that the
 declaration aff^d and the matter therein contained are altogether Insufficient in Law and that
 he thereto hath noe need or by the Law of the Land in any sort hold to answer for sponle he never-
 theles^t saith that the said Hugh Porter at the time of the making the writing Obligatory aff^d
 and long before was and since hath been an under Sheriff of the County of Somerset &c^r to wit
 at the County in due form of Law according to the Laws usages and customes of this province
 appointed and Qualifid and that the said John Didel in the writing Obligatory aff^d and the
 condition of the same named was by due form of Law at the time of the making the writing Obli-
 gatory aff^d in the custody of the said Hugh Porter as under Sheriff of the same County to wit
 at the County and the aff^d Patrick Conely further saith that that writing was made to and
 accepted by the said Hugh Porter by Colour of his Office of under Sheriff of the said County of
