Thereupon afterwards to witt the twentieth day of November One thousand Seven hundred & thirty three before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at Diving Creek Cometh the said John -
Tunstall a squire as affd by his attorney affd and there his writt and declaration affd against
the said Patrick Connelly were not further prosecuted but voluntarily permitted his suit to be
discontinued. Therefore afterwards to witt being the same day by discretion of the Justices
for here were ad judged to the said Patrick Connelly Six hundred & two
pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges by him about his defence in that part sustained according
to the form of the statute in such manner of case there of lately made and provided and the said John
Tunstall in mercy and that the said Patrick have thereof Execution &c

Samuel Wilson -
Guardian to Mary Woolford } Mary Woolford Daughter of Levin Woolford and Sarah his wife an
Orphan having arrived at full age for the removing of her Guardian came here
into Court in her proper person and prays that she may be admitted to choose aforesaid Samuel
Wilson of Somerset County Gent her Guardian which is by the Court here to her granted &c

Thereupon the said Mary Woolford makes chose of the said Samuel Wilson as her
Guardian accordingly &c Whereupon It is ordered by the Court here that the said Samuel
Wilson take into his care and possession the said orphan and her whole real and personall and
further it is by the Court ^{ordered} that the said Samuel Wilson give recognizance with two securitys for to
comply with the Guardian ship affd &c Thereupon the said Samuel Wilson with William Stoug-
hton and Henry Ballard of Somerset County Gent his securitys present herein Court in their pro-
per person acknowledged themselves to be indebted unto the said Mary Woolford in five
hundred pounds current money of Maryland of their bodys goods or Chattells Lands or tenements
to the use of the said Mary Woolford her heirs or assigns to be made and Levied &c If it happen
that the said Samuel Wilson do not comply with the Law in relation to the Guardian ship affd
and do not deliver up unto the said Mary Woolford all her Estate real and personall that
he shall have in his hands and possession peaceably and quietly when ever the same shall be Legally
Required &c

Ordered by the Court that the Reverend Thomas Fletcher pay or cause to be paid unto Thomas Duncan
and James Lindor thirty pounds of tobacco each for their attendance one day each on behullf of
the said Thomas Fletcher against John Tunstall a squire of Hugh Porter he having made oath to
the same &c
