Charles Ballard and Joseph Wailes of Somerset County Gent^{rs} are appointed Burners of tobacco in Wickanowoc Hundred in the said County according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Mitchell Dawhicle and Doubly Collier of Somerset County Gent^{rs} are appointed Burners of tobacco in Nantuxete Hundred in the County and according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Charles Rankliff and James Rownd of Somerset County Gent^{rs} are appointed burners of tobacco of Walthora Hundred in the said County according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

The Justices of Somerset County did agree with Mr. Alice Ellis and Mr. John Handy who keeps ferry over Wickanowoc River in and for the County and with Mr. James Martin & Wm. Stevens who keeps ferry over Poromote River, in and for the same County, in manner and form following viz. That whereas they the said Alice Ellis, John Handy, James Martin and Wm. Stevens had obtained his Lordship's License for the keeping of ferry over the Rivers and at their usual places, and if they do deliver up into the several person or persons or make satisfaction unto them for all or what money or other thing or things that they had received from any person or persons living within the County and for ferridges since the last November last

That then the said Alice Ellis, John Handy, James Martin and William Stevens ^{to have} their full allowances as if they had kept free ferry the year as usual. and further it was agreed that the said Alice Ellis John Handy James Martin and William Stevens to find and provide a good and sufficient Boats and give good attendance to their several and respective ferries over the Rivers and for the passing and repassing of all those that shall have occasion to make use of the same ferry &c.

Ordered by the Court that if Mr. Mary Hicks and Mr. Elizth Lane who used to keep free ferry over Nantuxete River for Somerset County do obtain his Lordship's License for the keeping of ferry over the above said River and do comply with the above said agreement with Mr. Alice Ellis, Mr. John Handy, Mr. Martin and William Stevens in every respect and find and provide a good Boat and give good attendance to the said ferry, that then they the said Mr. Mary Hicks, and Mr. Elizth Lane, to have their usual allowances as if they had kept free ferry the full year &c.
