John Dennis Dmd^d and Sampson Wheaten of Somerset County Gent^{are} appointed Burners of tobacco in
Amanape hundred in the County and according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Charles Ballard and Joseph Waiter of Somerset County Gent^{are} appointed Burners of tobacco in
Wickanomoy hundred in the said County according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Mitchell Dashille and Doubly Collier of Somerset County Gent^{are} appointed Burners of tobacco in
Nanticoke hundred in the County and according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

Charles Rackliff and James Rownd of Somerset County Gent^{are} appointed Burners of tobacco at
Waltomore hundred in the said County according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c.

The Justices of Somerset County did agree with Mr Alie Ellis and Mr John Hand^y who
keeps ferrys over wickanomoy River in and for the County and with Mr James Martin & Wm.
Stevens who keeps ferrys over Potomac River, in and for the same County, in manner and form
following vid^e. That Whereas they the said Alie Ellis, John Hand^y, James Martin and Wm.
Stevens had obtained his Lordships Licence for the keeping of ferrys over the Rivers at their
usual places, and if they do deliver up unto the severall person or persons or make satisfac-
tion unto them for all or what money or other thing or things that they had received from any
person or persons living within the County and for ferrymage since the last November found &c.

That then the said Alie Ellis, John Hand^y, James Martin and William Stevens ^{to have} their full
allowance as if they had kept free ferrys a year as usual. And further it was agreed that
the said Alie Ellis, John Hand^y, James Martin and William Stevens to find and provide good
and sufficient Boats and give good attendance to their severall and respective ferrys over the
Rivers at, for the passing and repassing of all those that shall have occasion to make use of the
same ferrys &c.

Ordered by the Court that if Mrs Mary Hicks and Mr Eli^s Lane who used to
keep free ferrys over Nanticoke River for Somerset County do obtain his Lordships Licence for the
keeping of ferrys over the above said River and to comply with the above said agreement with Mr. W^m Hand^y
Mr Martin and William Stevens in every respect and find and provide a good Boat and give good attend-
ance to the said ferrys, that then they the said Mr. Mary Hicks and Mr Eli^s Lane, to have their usual allow-
ances as if they had kept free ferrys the full year &c.
