further leave hereof to Imparle hereuntill Next Court and he hath it and the same  
Day is Given to the afo Betty herealso &?

At which Said Next Court to witt the Twentieth Day of November And Dowd One  
thousand Seven hundred and Thirty three came again as well the afo Betty Gale as the  
afo William Whittington by their Attorneys afo and whereupon the Said William pray  
further leave hereof to Imparle hereuntill Next Court and he hath it and the same  
Day is Given to the afo Betty herealso &?

At which said next Court to witt the nineteenth day of March and Dowd One thousand Seven  
hundred and Thirty three came again as well the afo Betty as the afo William by their attorneys afo  
and the same Attorney of the same William says nothing in Barr or prelusion of the action  
afo of the afo Betty, by which the same Betty remained Imprisoned against the afo William

so there of Indebted on Consideration Thereof upon himself Did Assume & to the Said Ambro<sup>s</sup> then and
