Therefore it is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid sum of One thousand pounds of tobacco so as aforesaid attached be condemned in the hands of the said William Houston, Peter Beckett and William Jones as of the Right and Credit of the said Thomas Boorman towards satisfying unto the said Charles Ramsey his damage, and all Costs and Charges by means of the attachment aforesaid and that the said Charles Ramsey have thine of Etchington &c

Donshoe Daniel Townsend James Townsend Edmund Dickerson and humbly  
Saveth that whereas your petitioners have had a road these forty years through our Lands and have  
maintained the same at our own Costs which said road is now stopped up by Charles Dickerson so that we cannot  
pass to our Lands without great prejudice and inconvenience to your worshipps petitioners we  
therefore pray that your worshipps will grant such order that your petitioners have our old road  
continued it not being prejudicial to the said Charles Dickerson or any other person whatsoever  
and we will maintain the same at our own Costs and as in duty bound shall ever pray &c

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation thereupon had  
wherefore It is considered and ordered by the Court here that John Scott lay out a road for the  
Inhabitants aforesaid the honest and best <sup>way</sup> and the least of prejudice to any person as by the petition  
aforesaid is prayed for

I the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of Somerset County do hereby Certifie that on  
the second day of April 1794 came before me John Stewart and took the severall Oaths to the  
Government and the Oath of Underforfice and Subscribed the test and Oath of abjuration Intestino-  
ing whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 3<sup>r</sup> day of April 1794. Willm Stoughton.

Ordered by the Court that James Train be Overseer of the Roads from Jenkyns Hickory to  
Train's Sevenborough and from thence to Pewashopee and from Faringdale Road opposite from  
Jane Donelons plantation into the Road that leads from Quantic to Pewashopee and to the up-  
landing by James Givens plantation &c

Ordered that Robert Collier be Overseer from Capt John M'Gesters along by Wm Vaughans into  
the main Road and from the bridge at the head of Ellyquin to Followayes tree and from his own house  
to the great Beach &c

Ordered that Thomas Cowper <sup>overseer</sup> of the roads from the Cypress Bridge to the Pugpett at  
Springhale, and from the Cypress Bridge into the main Road that leads by John Priestells &c
