

bound by the Court hereinto the afo^rd William More while he arrives at the age of Twenty One Years the said Alexander Tully being ten years of age next August the said Alexander Tully to serve his said Master the free term of three afo^rd during which term the said Alexander Tully his said Master will and faithfully shall serve his Master keep his Commandments Lawfully and honestly every where willingly shall do and in all things as good and faithful servant shall deserve himself towards his said Master and all his during the term afo^rd.

In consideration of which service the said William More present here in Court in his proper person answers with the Justices of the same Court, in Court judicially sitting, on behalf of the said Alex^r Tully, that he the said William More during the term afo^rd will learn his said apprentice the trade of a weaver, and give him one year's Schooling between the date hereof, and the time that the said apprentice shall arrive at the age of sixteen years, and give him ane suit of Cloathes at the Expiration of his Servitude over and above his common weaving Cloathes and Likewise provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Clothing sufficient for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term afo^rd.

Whereupon it is ordered by the Court here that the afo^rd William More give Security for to comply with the covenants afo^rd. Thereupon the said William More with certain Jacob Meffey of Somerset County planter his Security both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves to owe unto the afo^rd Alex^r Tully the sum of twenty pounds Sterling of their several Goods and Chattells Lands and tenements to be made and levied to the use of the said Alexander Tully his heirs or assigns. If it happen that the afo^rd William More do not during the term of Servitude afo^rd teach his said apprentice the trade of a weaver, and do not give him one year's Schooling between this day and apprentice shall arrive at the age of sixteen years, and do not give him ane suit of Cloathes at the Expiration of his Servitude over and above his common weaving Cloathes, and do not provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Clothing sufficient for such an apprentice to have and wear during the term afo^rd.
