At which said next Court to Witt the <sup>and said one thousand seven hundred & thirty four</sup> eighteenth Day of June Came againe as well the aff<sup>d</sup> Benjamin Sharp as the aff<sup>d</sup> John Burnale by their attorney aff<sup>d</sup> and whereupon the aff<sup>d</sup> John Burnale as before defends the force and Injury when &c: and says that he did not assume upon himselfe in manner and form as the aff<sup>d</sup> Benjamin above against him hath complained and of this he puts himselfe upon the County &c. and the selfe in like manner -

And after words to Witt the Sunday and Year Last above mentioned the same Benjamin Sharpe by his attorney aff<sup>d</sup> Corneth here into Court and Confesseth that he will noe further prosecute against the aff<sup>d</sup> defend<sup>t</sup> in the plea aff<sup>d</sup> &c.

Therefore it is Considered that the aff<sup>d</sup> Benjamin Sharp take nothing by his writt and Declaration aff<sup>d</sup> but be in merry for his false Rumour and that the said John Burnale lose thereof without Day and further it is Considered that the aff<sup>d</sup> John Burnale Recover against the aff<sup>d</sup>
