 premises aforesaid and Verdict aforesaid before Judgment thereof rendered day is further given to the parties aforesaid  
 here until next Court of hearing thereof their Judgment for that the same Justices here thereof as yett &c.

Att which said next Court to witt the nineteenth day of March and Dow One thousand Seven hundred  
 and thirty three came again as well the aforesaid Robert Denton Henry who &c. as the said Moses Charles  
 Ind. by his attorney aforesaid and because the Justices here themselves will further advise of and upon the  
 premises and Verdict aforesaid before Judgment thereof rendered day is further given to the parties aforesaid  
 here until next Court of hearing thereof their Judgment for that the same Justices here thereof as yett &c.

Att which said next Court to witt the Eighteenth day of June and Dow One thousand Seven hundred  
 thirty four came again as well the aforesaid Robert Denton Henry who &c. as the said Moses Charles Ind. by his  
 attorney aforesaid and whereupon all and singular the premises here being seen heard and fully understood

It is considered by the Court here that the aforesaid Moses Charles Ind. pay to his Lordship the Lord  
 Proprietary for his fine by the Court here upon him imposed by Conviction of the adultery aforesaid whereof  
 he is found guilty three pounds current money and that the same Moses Charles be taken to satisfaction  
 of the fine aforesaid.

 and Thomas Fletcher four years by his indenture is specified as also twenty

 ed his freedom dues as the Law directs from the said Thomas Fletcher he the said Thomas Fletcher  
 not only refuses to pay the same but detains your petitioner as a servant therefore your petiti-  
 oner humbly prays your worships will set him at Liberty and give order for his freedom dues to be  
 paid him and he as his duty bound will pray &c. thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of  
 Somerset County that he should summon the aforesaid Thomas Fletcher so that he might be and appear immediately  
 here
