Ordered by the Court that Patrick Dailey pay unto Stephen Coston two hundred and ten pounds
of tobans being due unto him for his attendance Seven days as an Evidence on behalf of the said Pat
Dailey at Suit of Edward Harper he having made oath to the same &c

Ordered by the Court that Patrick Dailey pay unto Mary Cantwell One hundred and twenty pounds
of tobans being due unto her for her attendance four days as an Evidence on behalf of the said Pat
Dailey at Suit of Edward Harper she having made oath to the same &c

Ordered by the Court that Francis Elliott pay unto Henry Windsor thirty pounds of tobans it being
due unto him for his attendance one day as an Evidence on behalf of the said Francis Elliott against
William Gunn he having made oath to the same &c

Phillip Curry a poor Infirm man upon application to the Court, is adjudged by the
same Court here to be Free for the future &c

Ordered that William Nelson have an Order on the Sheriff for One thousand pounds of tobans he
bringing to Court the best piece of Linnen according to act of assembly in such case made and provided &c

Ordered that James Strawbridge have an Order on the Sheriff for Eight hundred pounds of tobo.
he bringing the second best piece of Linnen according to act of assembly in such case made and provided

Ordered that Joshua Singer have an Order on the Sheriff for Six hundred pounds of tobans
he producing to the Court the third and last best piece of Linnen according to act of assembly in
such case made and provided &c

petition ^{ap} is proved &c
