of Henry Smith late of Somerset County planter in your bailiwick that he should -  
make three pounds five shillings current money and six hundred and eighty pounds of tobacco which to -  
John Horsey in his Lordships County Court of Somerset before the Justices thereof at dividing Bench were -  
adjudged for his damages which he had by occasion of a certain promise and assumption to the same John  
Horsey by the said Henry Smith made and not performed and that same money and tobacco he should have  
before the Justices of his said Lordships County Court of Somerset to be sold at dividing Bench in the City  
of the third Wednesday of June then next to satisfy the said John Horsey of his damages and who of the  
was levied and that thereof he should not fail . . .

At which said third Wednesday of June to wit the Eighteenth day of the same month and Dowd one  
thousand Seven hundred and thirty four came the said John Horsey in his own proper person and the  
Sheriff of Somerset County to whom the foregoing writ was directed Likewise came and made return that  
he had made of the goods and Chattels of the said Henry Smith as will appear in a certain Schedule  
in those words following vizt. A Schedule of goods attached for the use of John Horsey from Henry Smith one  
horse to the value of three pounds five shillings current money and one hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco

of the peace for the County of Somerset in the province of took the several Oaths to the Government  
according to the directions of the acts of Parliament of Great Brittain and this province in that  
Case made and provided as also the usual Oath of Office and at the same time he the said  
Thomas Boreman signed the Oath of Allegiance and test
