Whereupon it is ordered by the Court here that the said Benj: Lebruse give security for to comply with the covenants afo're.

Thereupon the said Benjamin Lebruse with Thomas Bannister of Somerset County planter his security both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto the afo're Roger Mare in twenty pounds Sterling of their body's goods or Chattels Lands or tenements joyntly and severally to be made and levied to the use of the said Roger Mare his heirs or assignes if it happen that the afo're Benj: Lebruse do not during the term afo're bear his said apprentice to Reed with and by phe as far as the rule of three (and the trade of a weaver if his wife Liver) and do not at the expiracion of his servitude give him a new suit of Coath: over and above his common weareing Coath: and do not likewise provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Coath:ning sufficient for him to have and weare during the time of servitude afo're.

Now heretofore this day to witt the twelveth day of August anno Domini One thousand
Seven hundred and thirty four came he into Court in his proper person the afo're John Beachamp
and prays that he may be admitted to those a certain Daniel Hull of Somerset County planter his
guardian which is to him granted &c. Whereupon the said John Beachamp makes choice of the said
Daniel Hull as his guardian accordingly &c. Whereupon it is ordered by the Court here that the afo're
Daniel Hull the now guardian take into his care and posseposse the afo're John Beachamp and all his Estate
both Real and personall, and that the said Esq: or admt: of Dow Hull deb the former guardian
deliver the same &c. and further it is ordered by the Court here that the said Daniel Hull now
guardian give security for to comply with the guardianship afo're.

Whereupon the said Daniel Hull with Richard Brooks and William Bellin of Somerset County
planters his security all present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves
to owe and be indebted unto the said John Beachamp in the sum of One hundred pounds Sterling
good and Law full money of England of their body's goods and Chattels Lands or tenements to the
use of the said John Beachamp to be made and levied if it happen that the said Daniel Hull
do not comply with the Law in relation to such guardians as afo're and do not deliver up unto
