In consideration of which service the said Thomas Tyler present here in Court ^{in his} proper person Covenanteth with the justices of the same Court Judicially sitting in manner and form following that is to say that he the said Thomas Tyler during the term aforesaid will learn his said apprentice to Read write and Cypher as farr as the rule of three Inclusive and the trade of a Weaver and at the Expiration of his Servitude give him a new Suit of Cloaths over and above his common wearing Cloaths and likewise provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Cloathing mete for such an apprentice to have and wear during his Servitude aforesaid. — Whereupon it is Ordered by the Court here that the said Thomas Tyler give security for to Comply with the Covenants aforesaid. — Thereupon the said Thomas Tyler with Arthur Parks of Somerset County planter his Security both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves Indebted unto the said Tiler Crockett in thirty pounds Sterling each of their body Goods or Chattels Lands or Tenements Separately to be made and Secured to the use of the said Tiler Crockett his heirs or assigns if it happen that the said Thomas Tyler do not during the term aforesaid learn his said apprentice to read write and Cypher as farr as the rule of three Inclusive and the trade of a weaver and do not at the Expiration of his servitude give him a new Suit of Cloaths over and above his common wearing Cloaths and do not likewise provide for his said apprentice meat drink washing Lodging and Cloathing mete for such an apprentice to have and wear during his Servitude aforesaid.
