Thomas Larrimore Junr. is to answer &c. and afterwards to wit the twentieth day of August and Dord: One thousand seven hundred and thirty four before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset now here held at Dividing Creek in the same County came the said Thomas Larrimore Junr in his proper person according to a certain recognizance by him and his security in that part first acknowledged and had a hearing of the Indictment & and says that he is not guilty thereof and of this he puts himself upon the Country and William Goldsbo: and says that he is not guilty thereof and of this he puts himself upon the Country and William Goldsbo: rough Gent: attorney of his Lordships and who for his said Lordships in that part followeth Likewise whereupon it is commanded the Sheriff of Somerset County that immediately he should cause to come here before the Justices twelve &c. by whom &c. and who neither &c. to recognize &c. because as well &c. and afterwards immediately cause him of the Jury by Joseph M'Glester Gent: Sheriff of the County to him impanelled being called came to wit, Joshua Calwele Robert Middle Jonathan Bound John Whitehouse Ralph Millborn Angelo Atkinson Jacob Adams Joseph Houston Philip Quicke, John Alderson Robert Jones and Robert Stein who so say the truth of and upon the premises &c. being elected byed and sworn upon their oaths did say that the aforesaid Thomas Larrimore Junr. is guilty of the premises in the Indictment &c. Specified in manner and form as by the Indictment &c above against him supposed &c.

Whereupon all and singular the premises

by the Court here seen heard and fully understood it is considered that the aforesaid Thomas Larrimore Junr. pay unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine by the Court thereupon him imposed for and by Occasion of the premises &c. whereof inform as he is Convict thirty shillings currant money for the use of the County &c. and that the same Thomas Larrimore Junr. be taken to satisfy his said Lordship of the fine aforesaid Whereupon the said Thomas Larrimore Junr. is ordered to give security for the payment of the severall Officers fees due by reason of the premises &c. whereupon after-
ward John Larrimore of Somerset County planter present here in Court in his proper person undertook for the said Thomas Larrimore Junr. and acknowledged himself indebted unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary in the sum of five pounds Sterling to be levied of his body goods or Chattels Lands or tenements to the use of the Officers that shall any fees due upon the Indictment by means of the premises &c. to be made and levied if it happen that the said John Larrimore do not pay unto the severall Officers their fees due by means of the premises &c. upon the Indictment &c.

Likewise the said Thomas Larrimore Junr. is ordered by his Court here for to save and to keep harmless as well the Justices of Somerset County Court and their Sureties for the time being as also the Inhabitants of his County from all Costs Charges and Troubles by reason of the birth maintenance nourishing and bringing up of a
dead child lately begott on the body of a certain other Hopkins her

hereupon the said Thomas Larrimore Junr. with John Larrimore of Somerset County planter both present here in Court in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Lordship the Lord.
