had pay the Condemnation of the Court thereupon or tender his body to the custody of the Sheriff of Somerset County in satisfaction thereof that he the said Edward Fuller will do the same for him &.

Whereupon the said Thomas Gray by his attorney aff<sup>d</sup> pray'd that the said Alexander Bain to his declaration & may answer, but the same attorney of the said Alexander say'd that he is not informed by the same Alexander his agent of any answer for the same Alexander to the same Thomas in the plea aff<sup>d</sup> to be given and nothing else therof says in bar or preclusion of the action aff<sup>d</sup> of the same Thomas by which the same Thomas Recovered against the said Alexander whereof undefended &c.

Wherefore the said Thomas his damages by occasion of the non performance of the promise and assumption aff<sup>d</sup> against the said Alexander ought to recover but because it is not known what damages the said Thomas hath sustained by occasion of the non performance of the promise and assumption aff<sup>d</sup> therefore it is Commanded the Sheriff of Somerset, that by the Oath of honest and lawfull men of his Bailiwick he diligently Inquire what damages the same Thomas has sustained as well by occasion of the non performance of the promise and assumption aff<sup>d</sup> as for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appos'd and the Inquisition which hereupon he should take to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset to be held at Bridgwater the third Tuesday of August next under his seal and the seals of those by whose Oath he should make that same Inquisition he send together with the writs therof to him directed & the same day is given to the same Thomas there for.

All which said third Tuesday of August to wit the twentieth day of the same month and Day One Thousand Seven hundred and Thirty four before the Justices of his Lordships County Court of Somerset at Bridgwater aff<sup>d</sup> came the said Thomas Gray by his attorney aff<sup>d</sup> and the Sheriff to wit Joseph Maffester Gentleman returned a certain Inquisition Indented and taken before him at the Court house at Bridgwater in the County aff<sup>d</sup> the nineteenth day of August and Day One thousand Seven hundred and Thirty four by the Oath of Honest and Lawfull men of his Bailiwick by which it appears that the said Thomas Gray has Sustained damages by occasion of the non performance of the promise and assumption aff<sup>d</sup> further than his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part appos'd to three pounds One shilling and nine pence current money and for those costs and charges to one pound of tobacco.

Therefore it is Considered that the said Thomas Gray Recover against the said Alexander Bain his damages aff<sup>d</sup> by the Inquisition aff<sup>d</sup> in sum aff<sup>d</sup> appears also One thousand & Thirly Six pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges aff<sup>d</sup> to the same Thomas by the Court here of his appeal of which certain damages in the whole do amount to three pounds One shilling and nine pence current money and pounds of tobacco and the said debt in every other
