And whereupon the same Edward by William Bechingham his attorney saith that whereas the afo^r George the sixth day of July which was in the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred and thirty four at Somerset County afo^r by his certain writing obligatory had granted himself to be bound unto the afo^r Edward in the afo^r sum of sixty six pounds Sterling money of great Britain to be paid unto the same Edward when thereof afterward he should be required Nevertheless the afo^r George altho^e often required the afo^r sixty six pounds Sterling unto the afo^r Edward hath not paid but that unto him hitherto to pay altogether hath refused and still doth refuse to the damage of the same Edward Ninety nine pounds Sterling and thereupon he bringeth suit &c. and doth bring here into Court the writing Obligatory afo^r which the debt afo^r in form afo^r doth testify the date whereof is the same day & year afo^r &c. Pledges &c. John Doe & R. Roe

And the afo^r George West by William Goldborough his attorney comes and defends the force and Injury when &c. and says that he cannot gainway the action afo^r of the afo^r Edward Chambers nor can he say but that the writing Obligatory afo^r is the deed of the same George nor but that he owes the same Edward Chambers the afo^r sixty six pounds Sterling money of great Britain in Manner and form as the afo^r Edward Chambers above against him hath declared wherefore the said Edward prays Judgment for his debt afo^r and his damages sustained by Occasion of the detaining of that same debt to him to be adjudged &c.
