That Whereas the publick Road that leads from Cedar Creek ~~to~~ the said River doth goe through  
about of my land to the great hurt Damage and Discommoding of plantation whereof I pray an order  
of your worships to turn about a quarter of a mile of the said Road in Length and about three  
hundred yard distance in breadth from where the Road now is which I humbly pray your worships  
to be by allowing of the same and I shall in duty ever pray. David Hazzard

The petition afo being read and heard and fully understood Wherefore it is consider-  
ed that the afo David Hazzard <sup>turn the road</sup> according to the directions of Capt John Smith and George West  
the Overseer of the same Road, if they think it proper that the Road be turned, and if not that  
the said Road remaine unalterable
