he has lost several of his fingers and thereby is disabled so that he is unable of doing your petitioners  
any or but little service your petitioner therefore humbly prays that he may be released from paying  
taxes for the said negro and your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray David Johnson

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood wherefore it is considered that the aforesaid David Johnson be discharged for the future from paying of taxes for the aforesaid Negro as by the  
petition aforesaid is prayed

Whereas Maj<sup>r</sup> George Dashiel hath a negro man named Tom that's ancient and Infirm &  
whereupon at the prayer of the said George Dashiel he is discharged from paying of  
taxes for the said negro as aforesaid is prayed &c

Whereas Christopher Piper has a negro woman named Dido that's ailing and unwell &c. Whereas  
on at the prayer of the said Christopher Piper he is discharged from paying of taxes for the aforesaid negro.  
while please God to restore her to her health that she is able to Labour again &c.

Whereas Robt. King has a negro man named Toby that's ancient and Infirm and past his  
labour &c. Wherefore at the prayer of the said Robert King he is discharged from paying of taxes for  
the aforesaid negro Toby as aforesaid is prayed &c
