sterling for to comply with the Covenants afo Thereupon the said Thomas Gillis present herein Court acknow-
ledged himself Indebted unto the said William Death in ten pounds sterling of his body goods or Chattels
Lands or tenements to be made & Levied to the use of the said William Death his heirs or assigns if it
happen that the said Thomas Gillis do not during the term afo give his said apprentice a year schooling
and do not at the expiration of his servitude Cloath him well and do not provide for his said apprentice
meat Drink washing Lodging and Coathing mete for such an apprentice to have & wear during the term afo
