Be it remembered that William Goldborough Gent. attorney of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is who for the same Lord Proprietary in this part prosecuteth doth come hereinto the County Court of the same Lord Proprietary held for Somerset County a<sup>s</sup>. to wit at Dividing Creek in the County a<sup>s</sup>. the nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord God Seventeen Hundred and thirty four before Robert King Esq. and his associates the said Lord Proprietary his Justices of the same County Court and for the same Lord Proprietary doth give the same Justices hereto understand and be informed that Samuel Wilson late of Somerset parish in the County a<sup>s</sup>. Gent. the fifth day of November in the year of our Lord God seventeen hundred and thirty four at the parish a<sup>s</sup>. in the County a<sup>s</sup>. within the Jurisdiction of this Court and upon a certain William West of the same County planter in the peace of god and of the same Lord Proprietary then and there being with force and arms an assault did make and the same William West then and there did beat wound and evilly treat so that of his life it was greatly disjaired and other harms to him then and there did to the great damage of the same William West and against the peace of the said Lord Proprietary that now is his good rule and government &c. whereupon the same attorney of the said Lord Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary prayeth the advice of the Court herein the premises and that due process of Law in this part against the a<sup>s</sup>. Samuel Wilson may be made to answer unto the same Lord Proprietary of and upon the premises &c.

Thereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of Somerset County that he should take the said Samuel Wilson if he to answer &c. and afterwards to wit the nineteenth day of November and Days. One thousand seven hundred and thirty four before the Justice of his Lordship County Court of Somerset now here held at Dividing Creek County the said Samuel Wilson in his proper person answering to a<sup>s</sup> former Recognizance by him and his pledges in that part before acknowledged and had a hearing of the Information a<sup>s</sup> and being Justly demanded how he would acquit himself of the premises a<sup>s</sup>. by the Information a<sup>s</sup> above upon him imposed, says that of the premises a<sup>s</sup>. upon him imposed he is guilty thereof &c.

Whereupon all and singular the premises a<sup>s</sup>. being seen heard and fully understood &c. Wherefore it is considered that the a<sup>s</sup>. Samuel Wilson pay to his Lordship the Lord Proprietary for his fine by the Court here upon him imposed for and by occasion of the premises a<sup>s</sup>. and also of in fine a<sup>s</sup>. he is bound to two shillings and six pence current money and that the said Samuel Wilson be taken to satisfy his said Lordship of the fine a<sup>s</sup>. &c.
