Therefore by consent of the parties afo<sup>d</sup> it is considered that the afo<sup>d</sup> Richard Goldard Esq<sup>r</sup> recover against the afo<sup>d</sup> John Burnall his damages afo<sup>d</sup> to the afo<sup>d</sup> four thousand pounds of tobacco in form afo<sup>d</sup> confess'd as also three hundred & thirty one - - - - - pounds of tobacco for his costs and charges afo<sup>d</sup> to the same Richard by the court here and consent of the parties afo<sup>d</sup> adjudged and the afo<sup>d</sup> John in money &c - -

Somerset Esq<sup>r</sup> John Britt and Thomas Bellin late of Somerset County Gent<sup>m</sup> were attacked

to answer unto Herritt Ratchford of a plea of trespass upon the case &c

And whereupon the same Herritt Ratchford by Geo<sup>r</sup> Douglas his attorney complaineth that whereas the afo<sup>d</sup> John Britt and Thomas Bellin after the first day of May Ann<sup>d</sup> Dom<sup>o</sup> Seventeen hundred & five to wit on the third day of June Ann<sup>d</sup> Dom<sup>o</sup> Seventeen hundred & thirty three at Somerset County afores<sup>d</sup> within the jurisdiction of this court did make their certain note in writing called a promissory with their proper hands Subscribed bearing date the day and year last mentioned and the same note to the afo<sup>d</sup> Herritt Ratchford then and there did deliver by which note the afo<sup>d</sup> John Britt & Thomas did promise to pay to the said Herritt Ratchford or his order the sum of Seven pounds Eleven Shillings & nine pence current money of Virginia at four months after the date of the said note for value of the said Herritt received which said sum of Seven pounds Eleven Shillings & nine pence current money of Virginia the said Herritt avers to be of the
