And Whereupon the same William Turpin by William Beckingham his attorney saith that whereas the said Benjamin in his life time to witt on the first day of October in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred & thirty one at Somerset County by his Certain bill obligatory which the same Wm Turpin with the Seal of the same Benjamin sealed herinto Court brings whose date is the same day and year acknowledged himself to owe unto the same Wm Turpin three thousand and Eighteen pounds of good & Merchantable tobacco at a convenient landing
