Wherefore for that your Petitioner is now remediless by the rules of Common Law and only releasable in a Court of Equity your Petitioner most humbly prays that that the said Patrick Burke may true and perfect answer make whether he did not deal with your petitioner to what value or whether he ever paid your petitioner any sum or sums of money and upon what Account and how and generally - Answer all and Singular the premises as if again particularly Interrogated and that your Worshipps will make such order and decree therein as shall be agreeable to Equity - - - - And your Petitioner will pray -

And the aforesaid Patrick Burke by Francis Allen his attorney Cometh and defendeth the force of Injury when &c. and prays Leave thereof to Impare here unto the bill &c. until next Court and he hath it and the same day is given to the aforesaid James here also -

All which said next Court to wit the nineteenth day of November and Term One thousand seven hundred and thirty four came againe as well the aforesaid James Lindon by William Berkeleyingham his attorney as the aforesaid Patrick Burke by Francis Allen his attorney and the Bill aforesaid being read and heard and fully understood and mature deliberation thereupon had &c.

Wherefore it is considered by the Justice here that the aforesaid Patrick Burke pay unto the said James Lindon three shillings current money &c. also it is considered that the aforesaid Patrick Burke recover against the said James Lindon two hundred - - - - 200 pounds of tobacco to the said Patrick by direction of the Justice here at his request for his Costs and Charges in that part sustained according to act of assembly which Law made & provided as adjudged &c.

To the worshipful Court of Somerset County Shire Gents. whereas we the subscribers were appointed by the worshipps to view a certain road at y<sup>e</sup> Indian River which was required to be turned by David Hazard and we have according to order been on y<sup>e</sup> Road and do find that the said road may be turned without doing either traveller or neighbour any harm or prejudice & therefore have ordered y<sup>e</sup> David Hazard to clear and grubb y<sup>e</sup> Road and it shall be good returned under our hands this 19<sup>th</sup> day of October 1734
