

December the 24th 1734 The Sheriff of Somerset County to wit Joseph M^rester Gentleman together with Es^r Robert King Es^r John Scott, Es^r James Martin and Es^r Thomas Gellis his Lordships Justices with the Clerk of the County did all meet at the Court house for the County of Wiltshire and Pursuant to his Lordships writt of Election did sit as a Court and did appoint aday for the Election of Delegates or Burgeses to serve in the next Generall assembly to be hold at the City of Amnapolis to wit Proclamation being made in Usual form the said Sher. and Justices did appoint the Election to be on Wednesday the fourteenth day of February next at which day the said Sher. With severale of the Justices of the County to wit Es^r Rob^t King Es^r John Smith, Mr W^m Stoughton Es^r John Standey and severale others the Court being called and his Lordships writt of Election being read the severale freeholders and others qualified to give a vote in the Election did vote, that Es^r Lewis Gale Es^r Robert King Mr W^m Stoughton and Maj^r Geo^r Dashiell as Delegates or Burgeses for the County to serve in the next Gen^l Assembly &c

Robert Scott You John Bishop Jun^r Henry Jarmie and Thomas Dunken do Confess Judgement to Robert Scott Shoemaker for the sum of two pounds five Shillings with 2/6 cost of Warrt. which sum was recovered & security by the said Robert Scott against John Bishop Jun^r on the ninth day of April last before me the Subscriber one of his Lordships Justices of the peace for the County of Somerset the said two pounds five Shillings with 2/6 cost of Warrt. to be levied of your bodies goods or Chattels land or Tenements for the use of the said Robert Scott in case the said John Bishop Jun^r shall not pay and satisfy to the said Robert Scott the said two pounds five Shillings with 2/6 cost of Warrt. so as afores. Recovered against him & with the additional costs thereon on the tenth day of Feb^r next an Acknowledgement of the above taken the 25th of May 1734 before me Jun^r Martin

The Court adjourn until the third Tuesday of March 1734
