The Depositions of George Horner aged fifty years or thereabouts taken upon a tract of land lying in Somerset County called Morancasit the fourth day of January annoq^{ue} Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty four before William Stoughton John Elzey & William M^r Tommy by virtue of a Commission issued out of Somerset County Court bearing date the twenty seventh day of November annoq^{ue} Domⁱⁿⁱ Seventeen hundred & thirty four to Examine witnesses to prove & settle the boundaries of the afores^d. land which sd. George Horner being sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God depoveth and sayeth that about twenty one year ago he heard Mr. John Roseman deceased tell Mr. Levin Woolford that he had waited for his Brother Roger Woolford seven years to survey his land and that he could not get him to do it so that he was obliged to survey it himself this deponant further declareth that the sd. Mr. John Roseman with Mr. William Whittington Surveyor of Somerset County together with this deponant & severall other persons went (the same day he had the afores^d. communication with the sd.
