

Company then present where they thought the mouth of the Creek was, but what answer was made he does not remember, but that the sd John Roseman himself said here is one Chop and there is an other Chop opposite to it on the other side and two Chops makes a mouth and there ordered the Surveyor to begin his survey on a point of Marsh (which he believes to be some what washed away and which the sd Mr. Roseman called the first Chop) bearing south Sixty two degrees East to the house of Mr. Randall Beckett and South Sixty Six degrees west to the house of Mrs Sarah Elzey which she now dwells in, and that accordingly the Surveyor Capt. began there and that he this deponent together with Henry Speer carried the Chain and that the first course went wide of the River but the Exact course he does not remember This deponent further declares that at the end of the first course he heard Mr. Levin Woolford tell the sd Mr. John Roseman he was well satisfied with the course hereon for it did him no damage this deponent further declares that as to the Gum and Hickory mentioned in Messrs. William George & John Rosemans depositions he knows nothing of them neither did he ever see them before this day, nor did he hear of sd Mr. John Roseman talk of them at y^e time y^e sd Survey was but since the said Survey he has heard severly persons say there were such trees all which he declares to be Just and true to y^e best of his remembrance and knowledge & further saith not
